### **Incoming Kindergarteners:**


- Students must have <u>5 books</u> read to them. Our goal is to foster a love of reading! Please feel free to read any book that is of high interest to your child. Bedtime is a great time to do this!
- Complete the story assignments for **1 book** that was read. Your child should complete this to the best of his/her ability.
- Complete the Reading Log Form.
- Students must practice letter recognition and letter sounds. It is beneficial for your child to be able to identify all the letters in the alphabet (out of order) and say the sound each letter makes.
- Read each sentence with your child (use the dots under words to help) and practice reading sightwords.
- Your child should also practice writing his/her name. (Handwriting sheet)

\*Upon completion of the summer reading assignment, your child should have the opportunity to read or be read to every day or night!




